- And More



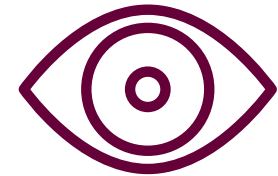

For decades, Neighborhood Watch programs have been the cornerstone of

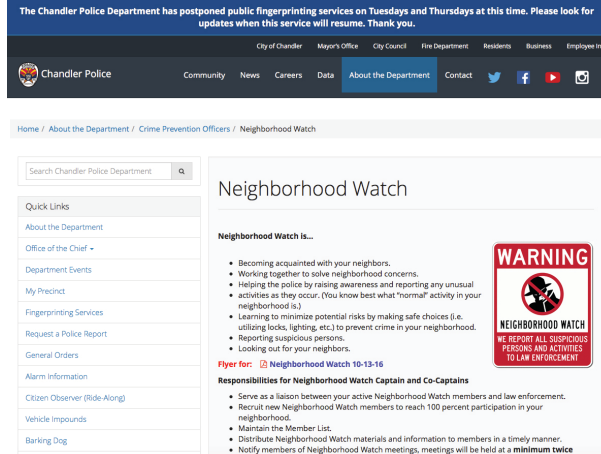
many crime prevention efforts. It brings together community residents and the police department to reduce and prevent crime.

What's the Process



The process of getting a Neighborhood Watch started is easy, but does have a few steps. The steps include:

- Contact your neighbors and see if there is interest in starting a program.
- Schedule a day, time and location for your meeting.
- Your Neighborhood Watch meeting will be hosted by you with an officer who is your guest speaker and will discuss crime prevention tips and information.
- Once complete, and questions/ answers have been addressed, the officer will leave to allow you time to focus on getting to know one another.
